This is just one of the many scams these people are using. They are also saying your owe money from an old credit card, from work done on your residence in the past or many other ideas. These are fraudulent.

We want to remind the public to not give credit card or bank information over the phone. Don't rush down to send cashier's check or a money order without confirming the story. Contact your relative or the business that states that you owe them money. Most companies will work with you if you do owe money to set up a payment plan. The phone number being used will most likely not go back to the legitimate business. Don't let your emotions get the best of you and don't let them strong arm you on the phone to give them your hard earned money. Be careful and cautious.
