



What's in a name?

The Cannon River between Faribault and Cannon Falls once supported as many as 30 mills. Hence, the name "Mill Towns Trail."

Project summary

- \$2.25 million request
- Construct connecting segment
- Rebuild existing parts where needed
- 3 miles of trail acquisition and development between Northfield and Dundas
- 1 mile of trail acquisition and development from Dundas to the west

Connecting the statewide trail system

- Connects the Sakatah Singing Hills State Trail and the Cannon Valley Trail
- Connects the cities of Faribault, Dundas, Northfield, Waterford, Randolph and Cannon Falls
- Provides more than 80 miles of seamless travel from Mankato to Red Wing

Highlighting local destinations

- Signs will direct users to local destinations such as stores, hotels and restaurants
- Signs will identify historic and environmental points of interest

H.F 2295 \$2.5 million request

Project summary

The regional hub will include:

- Public bathrooms
- Waiting area
- 42 parking stalls
- Convenient pedestrian and bicycle access



Regional and statewide significance

- Hiawathaland Transit identified the station as a key priority in increasing bus ridership.
- Northfield Line bus company will use the station for their daily routes to the Twin Cities.
- Exploring future service with Minnesota Valley Transit Authority (MVTA) for commuter bus.
- Station identified for future passenger rail and site planning consideration in design
- Regional transportation hub for major employment
- Northfield identified as a regional center and local redevelopment area
- Project expected to spur new economic development
